A recent discovery has been the *Peculiar Crimes Unit* series, by Christopher Fowler. The heroes of these books are the elderly detectives, Bryant & May, who head a unit, the PCU, whose mandate is to "settle sensitive cases with abstruse thinking, their purpose to prevent public panic and moral outrage." Not only will you be caught up in tricky mysteries, but rather esoteric histories of London past and present are revealed through the unorthodox methods of Senior Detective Arthur Bryant (who's really quite cranky). If you are a fan of classical detective stories and adore British tongue-in-cheek humor you will thoroughly enjoy this series.

As I write this we are back at the library with doors open to the public. It is so nice to be able to have my little people in the library again!

We are in the last few weeks of our online Library Summer Reading Program, *Imagine Your Story*, for kids, teens and adults. Our platform, Beanstack, found through the app store or on a banner on our website, allows participants to register and track their reading. It has been popular, with 800 people signing up in the first week! The Summer Reading Program ends on July 31.

We continue to offer great online entertainment and programs such as Roaming Reptiles videos with their creature of the week, bilingual concerts with the Super Stolie Guacamole, magic trick lessons with magician Chris Lopez, Pyjama Drama classes, mindfulness videos, digital photography instruction, craft videos, science videos and more. Families can follow us on Instagram, Facebook, and Twitter to learn about new activities and fun summer challenges.

I would like to share with you two teen fiction books and a children's nonfiction book that I read recently and really enjoyed. I like to read historical fiction, especially about World War II and I have many patrons who also enjoy this genre.

Her name is Sarah. She's blonde, blue-eyed, and Jewish in 1939 Germany. And her act of resistance is about to change the world.

After her mother is shot at a checkpoint, fifteenyear-old Sarah meets a mysterious man with an ambiguous accent, a suspiciously bare apartment, and a lockbox full of weapons. He's part of the secret resistance against the Third Reich, and he needs Sarah to hide in plain sight at a school for the daughters of top Nazi brass, posing as one of them. If she can be riend the daughter of a key scientist and get invited to her house, she might be able to steal the blueprints to a bomb that could destroy the cities of Western Europe. Nothing could prepare Sarah for her cutthroat schoolmates, and soon she finds herself in a battle for survival. But anyone who underestimates this innocent-seeming girl does so at their peril. She may look sweet, but she's the Nazis' worst nightmare.

Orphan Monster Spy by Matt Killeen can be found in our library or as a downloadable on Overdrive and Cloud Library.

World War II, 1942. A court decision makes women subject to the draft and eligible for service. The unproven American army is going up against the greatest fighting force ever assembled, the armed forces of Nazi Germany.

Three girls sign up to fight. Rio Richlin, Frangie Marr, and Rainy Schulterman are average girls, girls with dreams and aspirations, at the start of their lives, at the start of their loves. For the first time they leave behind their homes and families and go to war. They will fight the greatest war the world has ever known. **Front Lines by Michael Grant** can be found at the library or downloaded from Cloud Library and Hoopla.

In **On the Horizon**, Lois Lowry looks back at history through a personal lens as she draws from her own memories as a child in Hawaii and Japan, as well as from historical research, in this stunning work in verse for young readers. Books and audiobooks of this title can be found in the library and on Cloud Library and Overdrive.

Two of my other favorite World War II fiction books are Salt to the Sea by Ruta Sepetys and All the Light We Cannot See by Anthony Doerr.
