You can request unlimited passes, but you'll need to create an account after your pass expires. *The New York Times* is Funded by California State Library.

County of San Luis Obispo Libraries also provide access to our local paper *The San Luis Obispo Tribune*. The SLO Tribune Collection includes an Image format of The Tribune from December 2017-current, a text format from 2000-current, blog articles; and web articles.

Find current and archived articles on issues, events, people, government and more with the world's largest collection of full-text news sources. YOUTH CORNER...

Now that school has started I am seeing more kids in the library. I really enjoy helping them find what they need and seeing my young friends again.

My coworker Nancy and I have started offering Grab and Go Craft kits for our preschoolers. These kits will include all of the supplies that families will need plus instructions to complete the project. We plan to offer one new craft kit each month and one basic craft kit, for example a bookmark decorating kit with stickers. The first craft is an adorable scarecrow craft and will be offered starting October 1, while supplies last.

We will also have some Art to Go fall craft kits available for older kids that are being prepared by one of our crafting teachers, Debbie George. The fall kit includes cardstock, glitter glue stick, fabric leaves, felt shapes, and other elements to create 3-5 cards, postcards, or place cards. They will also be ready in early October and will be available while supplies last.

I really enjoy reading biographies and also graphic novels. The following graphic novels are some of the best examples of this combination: the March trilogy by John Lewis and They Called Us Enemy by George Takei.

Congressman John Lewis was an American icon and key figure of the civil rights movement. His commitment to justice and nonviolence took him from an Alabama sharecropper's farm to the halls of Congress, from a segregated schoolroom to the 1963 March on Washington, and from receiving beatings from state troopers to receiving the Medal of Freedom from the first African-American president.

Now, to share his remarkable story with new generations, Lewis presents March, a graphic novel trilogy.

March is a vivid first-hand account of John Lewis' lifelong struggle for civil and human rights. Rooted in Lewis' personal story, it also reflects on the highs and lows of the broader civil rights movement.

George Takei has captured hearts and minds worldwide with his captivating stage presence and outspoken commitment to equal rights. But long before he braved new frontiers in Star Trek, he woke up as a four-year-old boy to find his own birth country at war with his fa-

boy to find his own birth country at war with his father's and their entire family forced from their home into an uncertain future.

They Called Us Enemy is Takei's firsthand account of those years behind barbed wire, the joys and terrors of growing up under legalized racism, his mother's hard choices, his father's faith in democracy, and the way those experiences planted the seeds for his astonishing future.
