LIBRARY NEWS

Spring traditionally is a season of hope and renewal. It seems particularly so in 2022 as we look forward to life returning to normal. On another cheerful note, we're pleased to announce the return of Zip Books service. We want you to have the item you're looking for, so if you'd like a book or an audiobook that isn't available through County of SLO Public Libraries, please fill out our Suggest a Purchase form online, or with staff by phone or in the libraries. We'll do our best to fill your request. Zip Books is an alternative to traditional interlibrary loan. This free service is funded through the California State Library. Here's how it works:

- Eligible books costing \$35 or less, or books on CD costing \$50 or less, are shipped directly from Amazon.com to the library patron (not to the library).
- The publication date must be at least 6 months old.
- Patrons have up to 15 weeks to return the book to any library service desk.
- Patrons can have two Zip Books items delivered per month.
- Zip Books items are added to the collection if they fall under our collection development guidelines.

If the title you suggest isn't purchased as a Zip Book and is a popular current title, it may be purchased for SLO Public Libraries. Check our catalog to see if the book has been added to the collection.

Spring also brings one of our favorite annual events. County of SLO Libraries in partnership with Cuesta College are sponsoring the 2022 Book of the Year Program. Author Tommy Orange will appear at the Cuesta Performing Arts Center on Thursday, April 21 at 5pm for a lecture followed by a book signing. Tickets are \$5 for general admission and free for students at tickets.cuesta.edu . Tommy Orange is the author of *There, There,* one of *The New York Times* 10 Best Books of the Year and winner of the PEN/Hemingway Award. Tommy Orange's wondrous and shattering bestselling novel follows twelve characters from Native communities: all traveling to the Big Oakland Powwow, all connected to one another in ways they may not yet realize. We hope to see you at the CPAC in April or anytime at the Library.

There are some new events happening at the library! After a break of two years we now have our Storytime back. Storytime takes place every Thursday at 10:30 under the big blue sunshade behind the library, weather permitting. It feels so nice to be able to share books, songs and fingerplays with our young visitors again.

A new Tale Trail is up. This one is in conjunction with the County of San Luis Obispo Libraries Book of the Year, There There by Tommy Orange. Our new Tale Trail book is We Are Water Protectors. Winner of the 2021 Caldecott Medal and #1 New York Times Bestseller, the book is inspired by the many Indigenous-led movements across North America. We Are Water Protectors issues an urgent request to safeguard the Earth's water from harm and corruption—a bold and lyrical picture book written by Carole Lindstrom and vibrantly illustrated by Michaela Goade.

The 2022 Peeps Diorama Contest is coming this March and April. Kids, teens and adults are invited to submit a diorama of a favorite book, poem or nursery rhyme using at least two Peeps chicks or rabbits. Dioramas must be submitted by April 9. 
