LIBRARY NEWS

Summer is just around the corner and for libraries that means Summer Reading Program fun for everyone including the grownups. The theme for this year's program is Read Beyond the Beaten Path and features a reading challenge for a community goal to log one million minutes. Adults can sign up and then return their "I read minutes this summer" bookmark with their contact info at the end of the program at the Arroyo Grande Library. Winners will be drawn at the close of the program and patrons will be notified. This year's thematic prizes include camping gear such as a tent, hammock, coolers, camp chairs, lantern and more. The Arroyo Grande Library also has beautiful handmade quilts from our wonderful local organization the Quilting Angels as prizes for lucky participants whose names are chosen at random.

For readers who prefer to participate in Summer Reading Program virtually, they can sign up for the online component in Beanstack: readers will receive badges for logging minutes and earn raffle tickets to win grand prizes. Beanstack grand prizes are a little different than the branch prizes but they're still grand!

There is also some hopeful news for members of our community who are experiencing homelessness or mental health issues. In partnership with Transitions Mental Health Association, County of San Luis Obispo Libraries have created a Library Outreach Team staffed by a social worker and case manager. The Library Outreach Team makes regularly scheduled visits to our five largest libraries and can connect clients to resources for shelter, food, mental health, SSDI, health, basic supplies, and more. The TMHA outreach van is at the Arrovo Grande Library on Thursday mornings from 9 -11am. Thank you to everyone who donated supplies including sleeping bags, yoga mats, socks, etc. to the recent Quarterly Library **Outreach Team Donation Drive**.

YOUTH CORNER...

The 2022 Summer Reading Program is quickly approaching. This year the program, Beyond the Beaten Path, will consist of online book tracking on our Beanstack app, badge books for the first 1,000 kids who register for Summer Reading, bi-monthly grab and go activities for preschool, school age and teens, some live programming, and a prize raffle on August 1st for readers who tracked their progress on the Beanstack app.

The badge book is a place where Summer Reading participants can track their reading. It synchronizes with the Beanstack app, so readers can also track their activities online and earn digital tickets for raffle prizes.

There will be two Grab and Go crafts for each age group: preschoolers, school age kids and teens. The crafts will be available at the library in June and July. Some examples include leaf rubbing, fairy gardens and flower pressing.

The Arroyo Grande Library is participating in the Lunch at the Library Grant this summer. Our library will partner with the Lucia Mar School District to provide six hundred books and book bags to low income children in our community.

Our yearly Peeps Contest was a success. We had 10 creative entries; from Peter Rabbit and Old MacDonald to Harry Potter, the Shining and Poe's The Raven. This last entry was the grand prize winner. All the kids received Jamba Juice gift cards and coupons for three free items at the next Friends of the Library Booksale. All were excited to receive their prizes! We have a beautiful new carpet in the storytime area of the Youth Department. When you get a chance, stop by and take a peek. Families are enjoying the fresh new look.

We accept cash or check and are now able to process credit card and debit card purchases (with a minimum of \$10 purchase).
