

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LIBRARY NEWS

The Arroyo Grande Library has new hours, which started on September 8th. This change means our HICAP Medicare counselor will now be taking appointments the first and third Wednesdays of the month, by appointment, and that our passport services have expanded hours, also by appointment only. Finally, our Bookends book group will now be meeting on the 3rd Thursday of the month. The Arroyo Grande Library remodel continues to move forward. The expected closing date will be sometime in early to mid-2024. We will share the exact date with our lovely library customers and Friends as soon as we know it ourselves. To prepare for the remodel the Arroyo Grande Library will cease taking donations on December 31st, 2023.

On Friday, September 8th, International Literacy Day, County of SLO Public Libraries was proud to launch The Literacy Connection (TLC), a volunteer-based tutoring program that helps adults improve their literacy skills and empowers them to achieve their full potential. TLC team consists of dedicated, compassionate individuals who provide hope and practical help to residents who struggle daily because of limited literacy skills. Services will center around Adult Literacy, English as a Second Language (ESL), and Family Literacy. Materials and sessions are *always* **FREE and confidential**.

Tutoring for adult learners can include things like improving reading or writing skills, learning to vote, using a computer, or even passing the US Citizenship Exam. Tutoring for ESL learners can be something as simple improving one's conversational English skills in a friendly and welcoming environment. Family literacy tutors understand that families who learn together, thrive together. Parents and caregivers of children 17 years and younger can get help learning to read to children and actively encourage their early learning. Regardless, our TLC team will work to meet each learner's personal literacy goals.

If you, or someone you know, is 18 or older and looking for a rewarding volunteer opportunity to make a positive impact on someone's life, we are actively looking for volunteer ESL and English-speaking tutors! Teaching experience is welcome but not necessary. The only requirements are a desire to help, a patient outlook, and the ability to commit to this opportunity.
