This March brings the return of Free Tax Sundays to the Arroyo Grande Library. The United Way and the Arroyo Grande Library will be partnering every Sunday from March 3rd to April 14th to offer free tax assistance from 10-1. People with any income can come in with their documents and have a volunteer walk them through filing their taxes using the United Ways "My Free Taxes" software. There is no appointment required, by please come early to allow enough time to complete your taxes. There will not be tax assistance on March 31st.

The month of March also bring a new series of genealogy classes every Wednesday from March 6-March 20th from 3-4:30PM. The San Luis Obispo Genealogical society will offer classes on how to use the Library's free genealogical resources, and how to learn more about your own family history.

Happy New Year and welcome to 2024!

Our local school kids were out of school for several weeks over the winter break. We had some fun and educational events to entertain them here at the library.

Barbara created two take home "grab and go" crafts for the kids to have some fun at home. Both crafts were gnomes: one for older kids that required more hand dexterity and one for younger kids that was a simpler gluing and coloring craft. Take home crafts continue to be very popular here.

We also hosted a visit from Pacific Wildlife Care, who brought several animals to the library on a Wednesday afternoon during winter break. They brought a bat, an opossum and William Snakespeare, who is a gopher snake. This was a wildly successful event as over 100 people attended! Animal programs are also very popular.

Hidden around the children's section of the library were snow people, penguins and snowflakes so kids could search for them in a scavenger hunt. When they turned in their scavenger hunt sheet they collected a sticker as a prize. The hunt was up for the three weeks of winter break.

To finish off the kids' break we had a messy art event with four different ocean painting crafts. The kids painted using objects like straws and corrugated cardboard instead of brushes. They made some beautiful underwater art.

We have some upcoming events for February and March:

Kids will make their own healthy snacks with the Master Food Preservers on February 10 at 10:30. Reservations are required.

We will host a storytime with the firefighters from Five Cities Fire Authority on February 15 and 21 at 10:30. The firefighters read to the kids, do a little education about what to do in case of a fire and then show off their gear and vehicles. Last year we had several little firefighters attend in their gear also.

On Saturday, March 2 at 10:30 the Central Coast Aquarium will visit with their mobile touch tanks. The staff will let the kids gently touch the animals and educate them about our local tide pool life.
