This year's 2024 County of SLO Book of the Year selection is "Creep: Accusations and Confessions" by Myriam Gurba. Kirkus Review described this book as, "Profoundly insightful, thoroughly researched, incredibly inventive, and laugh-out-loud funny, this book is a masterpiece of wit and vulnerability. A truly exceptional essay collection about safety, fear, and power." The countywide Book of the Year program culminates from 5-7PM on Thursday, April 18th with a lecture and book signing by author, Myriam Gurba, at the Cuesta College CPAC. Tickets are available for \$15 through tickets.cuesta.edu. The lecture will also be streamed online that evening. Find out how to get your copy of this provocative book from the AG Library.

This Spring brings the return of our "Poetry and Pastries" event in honor of National Poetry Month.
