We are in the middle of our 2024 Summer Reading Program as I write this. This summer the kids are very excited to spin our new prize wheel each time they have read or listened to three books. They are really drawn to the wheel and I often overhear them asking to read more books or check out more books so that they can have more spins. They will ask to sit down and read immediately after hearing about the program. We also have a Quail Quest incentive program to collect a quail stamp for each library visit. This has also been exciting for kids. Who doesn't love to get stamps?

We have had some very successful programs this summer. We had a fun Summer Reading Kickoff Party with giant bubbles, yard games, take-home jam kits and face painting. Our bilingual musician Nathalia entertained more than 100 kids and their caregivers with music and dancing, egg shakers and bubbles. For our Fourth of July themed Maker Day, almost 60 participants made festive artwork. Our most popular event was our reptile show, Reptile Ron, who entertained and educated just under 250 people, plus let everyone who wanted to touch all of the animals. This was the highlight of my summer since I got to hold a huge albino Burmese Python. We still have many fun events scheduled for the remainder of the summer.

In early June I had the two largest Storytime groups that I have ever had. On Wednesday I had 79 participants and Thursday I had 80 people in attendance. It is wonderful to be able to spread out under our giant sunshade on the lawn. Our Storytimes have become very popular!
